Course Outline

This qualification reflects the role of highly skilled senior operators who use a broad range of hospitality skills combined with managerial skills and sound knowledge of industry to coordinate hospitality operations. This course will enable individuals to operate independently, have responsibility for others and make a range of operational business decisions. This qualification provides a pathway to work in any hospitality industry sector as a departmental or small business manager. The Diploma of Hospitality Management consists of 28 units of competency delivered over 12 months or 4 terms.

Course Requirements

The Diploma of Hospitality Management consists of 28 units of competency delivered over 12 months or 4 terms. There are no pre-requisites for entry into this course and there is no practical training in the kitchen. However, students must attend 140 hours of work-based training (unpaid) in hospitality services to successfully complete this course.

Assessment Methods

AAPoly recognizes the diverse learning needs of students and has thus incorporated a range of teaching and delivery methods in the course offered. They include observations, discussions, written assignments, tests, examinations, and/or practical application/ work related projects, classroom instruction, group and individual work, field trips, teamwork activities and role plays. Assessments will be consistent with these training delivery methods.

Entry Requirements:

For International Students, the following are mandatory requirements:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- English level at IELTS 5.5 or above (with no bands lower than 5.0) or PTE Academic Score of 42 or higher (with no section lower than 36).
- Have successfully completed Australian Year 12 or equivalent.

For Domestic Students, direct applications are accepted.

- Have successfully completed Australian Year 12 or equivalent.
- Students without formal qualifications may submit a resume detailing working experience, supported by references from employers.
